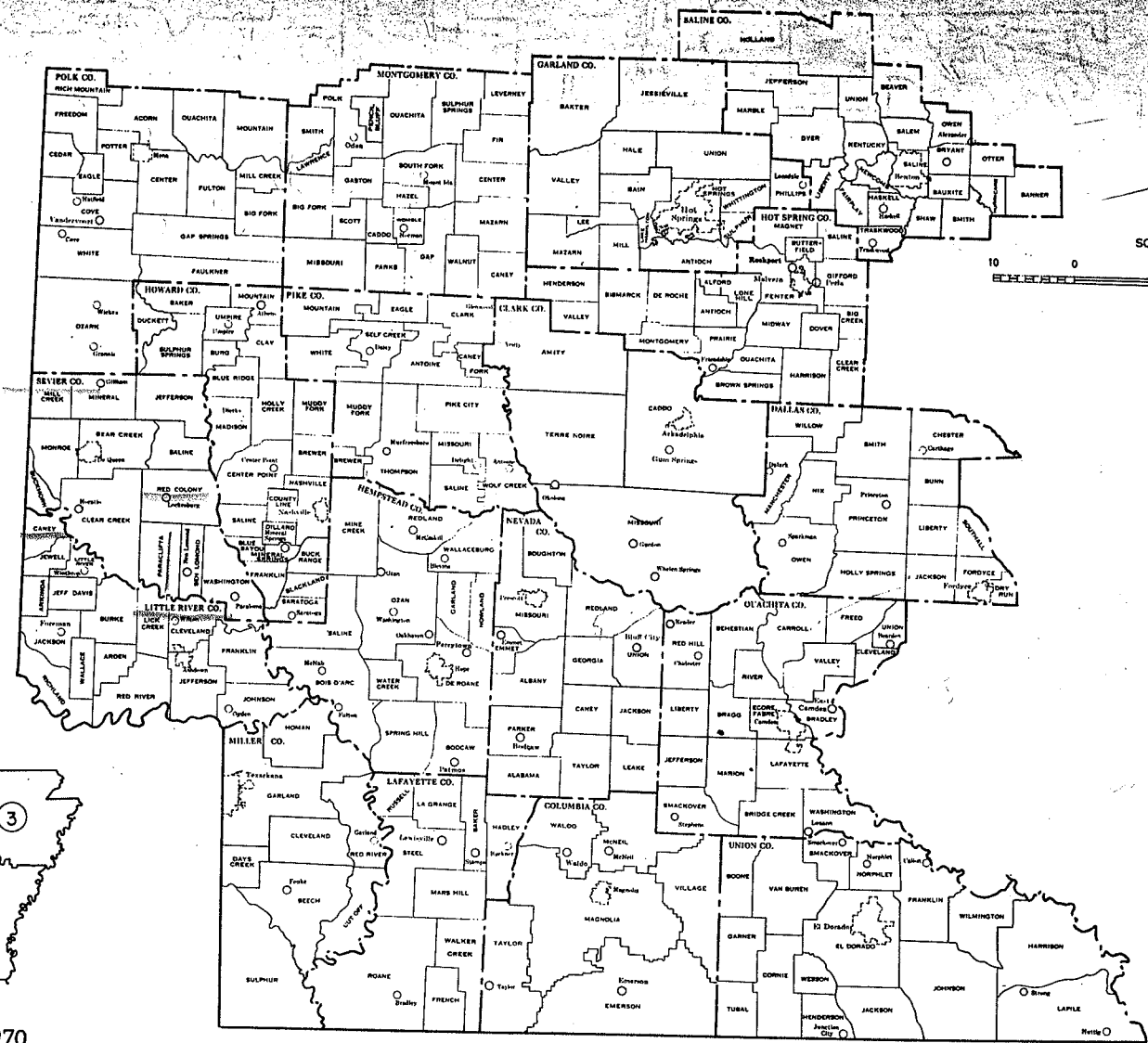

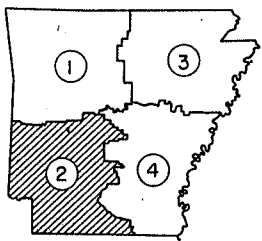

THE DOGGETT FAMILY

The surname "Doggett," originally "Duchett," is derived from a noble Norman family which established itself in England at the time of the Norman conquest in 1066 A.D. Early branches of the family were allied to nobility and royalty in the Middle Ages.

The progenitor of the Doggett family in America, the Reverend BENJAMIN L. DOGGETT, was born in Ipswich, England in 1636, the son of WILLIAM DOGGETT, a middle-class woolen merchant. At the age of 18, he entered St. John's College and, in 1659, Cambridge University, from which he received his masters of art degree in 1662. At graduation, he was ordained a minister in the Church of England and appointed curate of Stoke.

Within a few years, BENJAMIN DOGGETT had departed his native England and ventured to the Virginia Colony. He was presented to the Governor of Virginia for induction as rector of Christ Church and St. Mary's Parishes comprising portions of Lancaster and Northumberland Counties, Virginia. There he served the remainder of his life.

In England, BENJAMIN DOGGETT married JANE, whose surname is unknown. To this marriage were born five children: JANE, who was left in England; BENJAMIN, who accompanied his parents to America; and RICHARD (2), WILLIAM and ANN, who were born in Virginia.

The will of BENJAMIN DOGGETT dated March 14, 1681, states, "I bequeath my soul and body to God that give it, my body to be buried before ye pulpit in White Chapel Church..."

RICHARD (2) DOGGETT, second son of BENJAMIN, was reared by a step-father who apparently treated his ward more as a bond servant than a son. Lancaster County court records state, "Whereas BENJAMIN DOGGETT dec'd. complained to this court that JOHN BOATMAN who married JANE, Relict of said dec'd. did last year put his brother RICHARD to work in the ground with a freeman for $\frac{1}{2}$ share of corn and tobacco..."

RICHARD DOGGETT married ELIZABETH, daughter of RICHARD and APPIA BUSHROD. They remained in Lancaster County, where RICHARD acquired land, became an early planter and died "by unfortunate accident" in 1721. His will, dated June 20, 1721, mentions sons BUSHROD (3) and GEORGE, daughter ANN, and other children not named. His widow subsequently married CHARLES CHILTON.

BUSHROD (3) DOGGETT, progenitor of the pioneer BYARS, DOGGETT and SUTTLE families of Rutherford County, was born and reared in Lancaster County, Va. He married NANCY ANN STRIPLING (STRIBBLING), daughter of JOEL and MARY STRIPLING, and moved to what later became Culpepper County, Virginia, where he died in 1791. His will names nine children: MILLY (4), GEORGE, BENJAMIN, SARAH ANN, (4), RICHARD, ELIZABETH, NANCY, SUSANNAH and JOEL. All four sons

served in the Revolution and two were killed.

MOLLY (4) DOGGETT, elder daughter of BUSHROD, married JOSEPH SUTTLE in Fauquier County Virginia about 1754. Around 1768, she and JOSEPH moved to Orange County, N. C., where they were joined by other related families, including that of her sister, SARAH ANN (4), who married WILLIAM BYARS.

Before the Revolution, the SUTTLE AND BYARS families moved westward across N. C. to old Tryon (Rutherford) County, where they settled on Broad River at Floyd's Creek. There they were later joined by GEORGE DOGGETT, brother of MOLLY and SARAH ANN.

During the Revolution, both JOSEPH SUTTLE and WILLIAM BYARS died, leaving MOLLY and SARAH ANN with large families to rear alone. Later in life, the sisters remarried; MOLLY to ISAIAH BLACKWELL and SARAH ANN to JOEL BLACKWELL.

MOLLY (DOGGETT) SUTTLE-BLACKWELL died in Rutherford County after 1816. An account of her descendents, the Suttle family, previously has appeared in this column.

SARAH ANN (DOGGETT) BYARS-BLACKWELL died August 12, 1823. Estate proceedings disclose the names of seven of her children by WILLIAM BYARS; NANCY ANN (5), who married her first cousin, GEORGE (5) SUTTLE; JAMES, who married ELIZABETH WALKER; SARAH; wife of the REV. GEORGE KELLY; ELIZABETH, who married JOHN KELLY; Stripling; GEORGE and CHARLES.

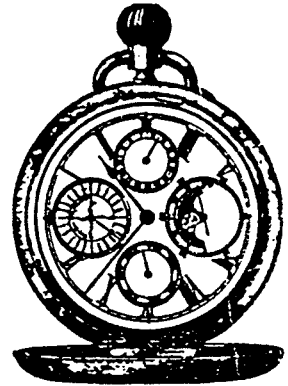
