Some of the earliest Kirks of North Carolina and their descendants have been given identification numbers, and the raised number at the end of the name is the generation number. The generation number does not mean that they are the first generation in America, but indicates it has not been proven from whom they descend. Some of the Kirk families are identified only with the county or counties in which they lived.

C., intestate. Stephen Kirk was married twice, and the second wife was Susanna \_\_\_\_\_, b. 1770 to 1780.

The reason for the extensive research in this compilation is to try to determine the father of Young Kirk, b. 7 Feb. 1787 in N. C. and the circumstantial evidence that is given in the Young Kirk compilation lends credence to the belief that he is a son of 18 STEPHEN KIRK<sup>1</sup>. Young Kirk would have been a child by his 1st marriage. If this premise is true, then 18 STEPHEN KIRK<sup>1</sup> would have married Susanna in 1788, as George Kirk, whom Susanna Kirk calls a son, was born in 1789 in S. C.

STEPHEN KIRK died intestate. The file on the settling of STEPHEN KIRK's estate names no heirs, except John Kirk, a son who applied for letters of administration. John Kirk's estate papers are filed in the same envelope. There were 2 sons named in Orange Co., N. C.: Thomas & Jesse Kirk.

Known sons for 18 STEPHEN KIRK<sup>1</sup> were Thomas, Jesse, George, John, Benjamin Franklin. Yet there were other Kirks in the Chester, Union, York counties area, some of which were too old to be sons of STEPHEN KIRK's 2nd family and others from the association with the same people of his known family would certainly seem to be children. Some probably are children of 18A Thomas Kirk<sup>1</sup>. To further complicate the relationships, who is the father of Henry Kirk who d. in 1823 in Union Co., whose legatees included a father and 10 brothers and sisters? 18 STEPHEN KIRK<sup>1</sup> and 18A Thomas Kirk<sup>1</sup> both dec'd. See the "Other Early Chester and Union Counties, S. C., Kirks" compilation.

Mrs. J. W. Crowder, 157 York St., Chester, S. C.: Early Ct. Minutes of Chester Co., S. C., were transcribed during WPA days and are in a single book in the office of the Clerk of Ct. The pages are numbered.

1791 Apr. 5, Chester Co., S. C., Ct. Minutes, p. 135 - Joseph Brown, James Knox, and William Gaston, presiding. It is ordered that the children of SARAH KIRK, wife of THOMAS KIRK, be bound out, that is, WILLIAM KIRK to PAUL GUTTERY and JOHN KIRK to ABRAHAM FERGUSON and it is ordered to be recorded and the said SARAH KIRK is authorized by the Ct. to execute the said indenture. (Since it is known that 18 STEPHEN KIRK<sup>1</sup> has a son THOMAS KIRK, that both Stephen Kirk and Sarah Kirk were in York Co. in 1790, they being the only Kirks, and both show in Chester Co., S. C. records after 1790, it seems this THOMAS KIRK is the son of 18 STEPHEN KIRK<sup>1</sup>.) Mrs. J. W. Crowder, 157 York St., Chester, S. C. 28706, historical researcher, publisher for Chester Co. area, states:

PAUL GUTTERY (Guthrie) wed ELIZABETH BELL. Her father John Bell was b. ca. 1717 and d. Sept. 28, 1794. His will abstract is enclosed. His grandson JOHN GUTHRIE is buried in the same grave as JOHN BELL. Old Paul's Graveyard was a Covenanter Graveyard.

I would imagine these people were part of the Rev. Wm. Martin's Covenanter colony which arrived here about 1772. They came from Aouny Antrim Ireland.

Abraham Ferguson lived in the same section but a little more to the southeast. I think this is the man who is buried in Old Hopewell Baptist Churchyard (Old Burnt Meeting House), where the last church burned about 1910. ABRAHAM FERGUSON d. 9 Nov. 1826, aged 75 yrs., 9 mos., 10 days.

From old Paul's Graveyard, near SE corner of Chester Co., now deserted and abandoned: Mr. John Bell d. 28 Sept. 1784, aged 77 yrs., and in this same grave his grandson Mr. John Guthrie, d. 17 Oct. 1820, aged 29 yrs. Inscription is on a single stone. The Strange papers say that Paul Guthrie's wife was Sarah Elizabeth Bell.

Though Thomas McDill's will names a son James McDill, this could not be the grandson of John Bell, UNLESS THOMAS MCDILL had been married twice, on account of the dates (THOMAS MCDILL b. 1726, John Bell b. 1717). I am rather inclined to think the James McDill above mentioned by John Bell to have been a son of Nathaniel McDill and not a son of Thomas McDill.

C., estate administered 18 May 1799 by Elizabeth Gutery, widow; William Gaston was Bondsman; appraisers James Dow, James Montgomery, William Gaston and were sworn by Joseph Gaston, Esq.; following owed money to estate: George Nicholas, Sam'l McClure, John Simpson, Ralph McFadden, Thomas Wylie, John Wiley, Jacob Brasfield, Doctor Harper, Thomas Moore. No list of heirs, no final division of estate.
